YBIS often face a tremendous uphill battle and adjustment period to find a new normal given their recent physical, mental, and psychological challenges. Life After Stroke is a platform for young brain injury survivors to build relationships, exchange resources and support each other in overcoming obstacles in their journey to recovery.

Tasks Managed in Year 2

It was a great privilege to be Chair of Life After Stroke for the 2021-2022 term. Along the way, I have met amazing individuals who all had the same goals of creating a supportive environment for young brain injury survivors and raising awareness about stroke in the young. As my term as Chair, I was able to use my training as a neurology resident physician to put together educational and informative resources for Life After Stroke, in the form of blog posts and content articles in our newsletter. Some blog posts include benefits of support groups, awareness on stroke in the young (for World Stroke Day), and pediatric stroke awareness. These blog posts were also a good way to spread the word about our organization over social media. I was also involved in writing the program descriptions for our website for our support groups and vocational rehabilitation program, that can be accessed by everyone.

Our newsletters involve content articles, personal stories written by stroke survivors, and updates from Life After Stroke. Some content articles published in our newsletters in the past included COVID-19 pandemic and stroke care and stroke recovery in the lens of an occupational therapist. We released a stroke recovery series this past year. The first issue was on inpatient stroke rehabilitation. The second issue released in June 2022 focused on mental health and stroke. We have a growing database of subscribers to our newsletter. I was also involved in working on our application for charity status. Additionally, I shared volunteer opportunities with pre-medical students and members of the Tamil Association of Residents of Medical Students (TARMS), which is one of our partners. I also was a speaker at one of TARMS' talks.


Functional Overview
